Interventional Radiology at CNHS: Past, Present and Future...



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Interventional Radiology at CNHS has evolved and grown over the past 5 years as we are transitioning from a PICC team to a collaborative and clinical service. The goal of this presentation is to introduce our team and describe the scope of image-guided, minimally invasive procedures and therapies that we offer. Some basic and commonly performed procedures that provide service and add value to our patients and hospital will be described. We will also highlight some more advanced procedures performed here and introduce some therapies that are currently in development for future clinical translation within the next 5 years.
