- Understand the fundamentals and basics of ultrasound use in the ED
- Learn novel uses of rapid MRI (magnetic resonance imaging) scans to diagnose pathology while reducing excessive exposure to radiation
- Discuss the common causes of chest pain in children
- Become familiar with management of scald and inhalation burns in children
