Our 40-foot vehicle travels throughout the greater Washington, DC area to places of employment, schools, organizations, and places of worship for sponsored blood drives.

Anyone age 17 or older can donate blood. Donors 70 to 75 years old must be a regular donor (donated in the past two years) and physically fit, healthy enough to donate, and weigh 110 lbs.
