We are trying to find out if this treatment is safe and well-tolerated in children and young adults with severe sickle cell disease. The transplant could cure the disease. You may be eligible to participate if:

- You have Sickle Cell Disease
- You are between the ages of 0-22 years old
- You do not have a matched donor

You will be responsible for the regular cost of hospitalization, physician visits, routine scans, blood tests, and other medicine used in your care. The trial will take place at:
