# The Young and The Restless: The Agitated and Intoxicated Teen

As the greater Washington, DC metropolitan area experiences a spike in synthetic drug use, providers are seeing an increasing number of intoxicated patients who are agitated or become agitated in practice areas throughout the hospital.
