




Having an out-patient EEG at a Children's National clinic





First, we will check-in at the desk in the clinic.



Then, we will wait in the waiting room.

I can bring a toy or special item to play with while I wait.



Next, my technician will call my name and we will walk to the EEG room.



I will see a computer in the room. My technician will use the computer.

In the room, my technician will help me sit or lay comfortably.






First, the technician will use a green colored cream and cotton swabs to clean areas on my head.

The cream may feel cold, but it does not hurt.

The technician will put a scoop of special paste onto their hand.



The technician will put the special paste on the end of colorful wires called leads.

The technician will place each lead onto my head, one at a time. The leads will be covered with a piece of gauze.





One lead will also be placed on my chest.

It's important I leave all the leads on my body where the technician placed them.



When all the leads are placed, the technician will wrap a strip of gauze around my head and tape the gauze in place.



The technician will place a white cap over the colorful wires and over my head, like a hat.

I will not touch my hat or leads.

I will stay in the room and take a nap.

I can bring my favorite pillow or blanket or teddy bear.



After my nap, the technician
will take off the leads.

The EEG test is done!

I can have a reward and will
leave the clinic!
