

Do you have a child under the age of 17 months?

The ORBEX Study is a research study being conducted at Children's National to learn more about preventing wheezing and asthma in young children. The purpose of this study is to see if a medication can help prevent wheezing in infants who are at risk for developing asthma.


Who is eligible for this study?

Infants who are under the age of 17 months and who meet ONE of the following requirements may be eligible:

- Have a diagnosis of eczema
- Have a parent who has or has had asthma

Study Details:

- The study will last three (3) years.
- There will be 12 planned study visits and 26 planned study phone calls throughout the three years.
- You will give your child the study capsules for 10 days every month for the first two years of the study.
- Testing includes a physical examination and collection of blood, stool, and nasal samples.



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
